What devastation has wreaked the super cyclone in the life of the people of Orissa? Answer: The super cyclone uprooted and crashed ancient trees on earth. People and homes were quickly washed away. An angry, deadly, brown-skinned water covered everything as far as the eye could see; only broken cement houses still stood in a few places. Bloating animal carcasses and human corpses floated in every direction. All round, even big old trees fell. Question 2. How could Prashant, a teenager, help the people of his town? Answer: Prashant, who was only nineteen years old, decided to lead the people of his town. He organized a group of youths and elders to press the dealer again jointly to share with his rice. This task was done successfully. For the first time in four days, the survivors at the shelter were able to fill their stomachs.
